BIKE TRAIL GRANT

On August 29th city staff attended an award ceremony at the Walmart Distribution Center in Beaver Dam where they were presented with a check for \$1,500 to go towards the bike/walking trail project. Earlier this year Council approved extending the current trail throughout the city, with the ultimate goal of connecting to the Wild Goose Trail located east of Hwy 151. The trail segment from Meadowview Park



to Edgewood Drive is targeted for completion in 2012. Also in 2012, contractors will

begin the design and engineering of the Edgewood Drive to Shaler Drive trail segment.

WASD faculty met in large and small groups for the district's first late start day of the year on September 14. The focus and continuing topic of discussion will be teacher learning groups using student performance data to adjust instruction so that all students learn the required material and academic achievement across the district improves. Students, meanwhile, were

actively engaged in learning activities supervised by support staff and volunteers.

As the year progresses and teachers develop greater collaboration around student learning, a "toolbox" of instructional modifications and interventions will be developed for students who are not being sufficiently challenged and for students who are struggling. That will

allow the district to fully implement the process known as "Response to Intervention" which all districts will be required to implement by 2013.

Parents are reminded that, if they want their children to participate in the before-school activities on late start days, they must sign-up their children in the school office for attendance purposes.

Fond du Lac County UW-Extension has planned an electronics collection event to take place Saturday, September 24 from 9:00am-3:00pm at the Fond du Lac County Fairgrounds Expo Building (Martin Rd. and Hwy 45/Fond du Lac Ave. in Fond du Lac).

All residents of the City of Waupun are invited to participate. Cost is \$5 per vehicle (cash only).

For \$10 (cash only), the electronics collectors will do a Department of Defense-approved hard drive wipe. To expedite the process participants are asked to bring an index card with their name and address clearly written.

Accepted items include electronics of all kinds, microwaves, vacuums, ovens, dishwashers, washing machines, and dryers. No

hazardous chemicals, air conditioners, dehumidifiers, freezers, refrigerators, explosives, batteries, or light bulbs will be accepted.
