TACO BELL COMES TO WAUPUN

On January 30th, the City of Waupun Plan Commission approved a site plan for a Taco Bell restaurant to be developed on the corner of Shaler Drive and E. Jefferson Street. Yesterday the deal became final when the closing on the property took place. The new owners, Jeff & Ann Firari, also own Beaver Dam's Taco Bell restaurant. Earthwork for the project will begin in March and construction of the building, which will house the Taco Bell restaurant and provide space for 3 additional tenants, is planned to be completed this summer.

4K NEWS

The Waupun Area School District is announcing two changes we are making for the coming school year. We are offering a five day option for 4-year old kindergarten next year at several sites. A 4K site will also begin at SAGES as well for the 2013-14 school year for our Fox Lake families. The Meadow View, SAGES, and Wee Care sites will have day care options before and after

school on site to help accommodate parents' busy schedules. Parents registering for 4K may pick up a "Waupun 4K" t-shirt for their child free of charge thanks to a donation! Before and after-school care will be provided at Meadow View Primary for students in grades K-6 through the YMCA for the 2013-14 school year. Students in grades 2-6 needing Y-Care will

be bussed to Rock River at the start of the day and back to Meadow View Primary at the end of the day as part of our bus route. The district will be eliminating most in-town bus stops next year as a cost-saving measure. We expect this change to save the district about \$35,000. You may register for Y-Care through the Y in Beaver Dam or by picking up a form at the district office.



Don't Pour Your Profits Down the Drain Milk Quality Series

The dairy industry is committed to producing safe, abundant and affordable milk and dairy beef of the highest quality. Healthy animals make for safe food, and disease prevention is the key to keeping cows healthy.

When dairy animals get sick and treatment is necessary, producers and veterinarians use drugs judiciously. Based on a 2005 University of Wisconsin study, 83 percent of antibiotic usage is associated with mastitis treatment. Several factors play into the choices an individual makes for mastitis treatment.

March 5th and March 6th, UW-Extension Sheboygan, Fond du Lac and Kewaunee Counties will be hosting ***"Don't Pour Your Profits Down the Drain" Milk Quality Seminar*** to help producers enhance their milk quality and increase successful treatment outcomes for mastitis. Meeting dates and locations include: March 5th, 10 am to 12 noon at Chissy's, Waldo, WI; March 5th, 12 noon to 3:00 pm, UW-Extension Fond du Lac County, Fond du Lac, WI; and March 6th, 12 noon to 3:00 pm, Kewaunee County Fair Grounds. Featured presenters include UW-Extension Milk Quality Specialist Pam Ruegg on "Should We Treat Them or Should We Eat Them" and Department of Agriculture, Trade & Consumer Protection District Veterinarian Ellen Hooker on "Drug Residue Déjà vu". An additional topic at the Fond du Lac and Kewaunee locations will include "What Lies Beneath: The Underestimated Cost of Mastitis" presented by UW-Extension Dairy & Livestock Agents Tina Kohlman & Aerica Bjurstrom.

The program is open to any individuals with interest regarding milk quality. The fee for the program is \$5 per person which includes materials and lunch.
