- Computer equipment
- Electronic Items banned from landfills

prevention. According to the National Fire Protection Association's statistics:

- Having a working smoke alarm in the home cuts the risk of dying in a fire by half.

- On average each year, no smoke alarms or no working smoke alarms contribute to 3 out of 5 home fire deaths.

Each year, during Fire Prevention Week, members of the Waupun Fire Department visit local schools and child care centers to discuss items such as: stop, drop, and roll, not playing with



lighters and matches, smoke alarms, escape plans, cooking safety, and calling 911. In 2013, between the presentations made at the schools and the fire department's open house, it is estimated that firefighters spoke with over 800 children.

This is also a great time of year to remind residents of Energizer's program, "Change your clock,

change your batteries". Smoke alarms should be tested monthly and the batteries replaced twice a year (when you change your clocks). It is recommended that smoke alarms be replaced every 10 years or sooner if they don't respond properly when tested. Fire prevention is a year round effort and we look to everyone to help be fire safe!




CRAFT-A-THON





Biomedical Science Program Continues To Expand (by Dave Burchardt)

Acronyms fill the air within the hallowed halls of the Waupun Area Junior Senior High School. PRIDE and PBIS are school-wide acronyms referencing behavior expectations; while acronyms such as STEM, BMS, PBS, and HBS reference the new and exciting curriculum in the Science Department. STEM stands for Science, Technology, Engineering, and Math which aligns with a national trend in preparing students for future careers. The U.S. Department of Commerce estimates that jobs in science, technology, engineering, and math (STEM) will grow 17 percent by 2018, nearly double the growth for non-STEM fields. By 2018, the U.S. will have more than 1.2 million unfilled STEM jobs because there will not be enough qualified workers to fill them. STEM is where jobs are today and where the job growth will be in the future. The Waupun Area School District has challenged administrators and staff to prepare students with the skills necessary to compete for future jobs that do not even currently exist. This has led the district to embrace curriculum from the non-profit Project Lead The Way, the nation's leading provider of STEM curriculum.

PLTW's Biomedical Science (BMS) program is a rigorous and relevant four-course sequence that allows students to play the roles of biomedical professionals as they investigate and study the concepts of human medicine, physiology, genetics, microbiology, and public health. Students engage in activities like investigating the death of a fictional person or dissecting a sheep's heart, learning content in the context of real-world cases. They examine the structures and interactions of human body systems and explore the prevention, diagnosis, and treatment of disease; all while working collaboratively to understand and design solutions to the most pressing health challenges of today and the future

Last school year science teachers Liz Olson and Dave Burchardt launched the Biomedical Sciences Program at the high school level with the first year class, Principles of Biomedical Sciences (PBS), being offered. This school year students who have completed the PBS class are eligible to enroll in the year two class, Human Body Systems (HBS). HBS students will examine the interactions of human body systems as they explore identity, power, movement, protection, and homeostasis. Students will explore science in action as they build organs and tissues on a skeletal Maniken®; use data acquisition software to monitor body functions such as muscle movement, reflex and voluntary action, and respiration; and take on the roles of biomedical professionals to solve real-world medical cases.


Educators are required to earn certification in the class before they can officially teach the course. Thus Burchardt spent two intensive weeks this past June at Milwaukee School of Engineering enrolled as a "student" in the HBS class performing the same activities and laboratory experiences that his students will conduct during class, concluding with a certification

to be eligible to teach the course. Newly hired science teacher Jessica Flasch completed her certification for the PBS course during this past July at MSOE, and will be joining Burchardt in teaching the PBS class this school year.

It is an exciting time in the science department as the BMS courses also align with the building goal of College and Career Readiness, not only the rigor and relevance of the content but also the career exploration component to the classes. Students in the district are truly fortunate that the Waupun Area Board of Education and Administration have embraced STEM education and are providing students the opportunity to develop the skills needed to be successful in life after high school. 


