FIRE DEPARTMENT ACTIVITIES

The Waupun Fire Department is excited to announce their annual **"Fill Our Tanks" food drive**, benefitting the Waupun Food Pantry, on **November 1 from 9am – 1pm**.

Food and cash donations can be made at the Waupun Piggly Wiggly, the Waupun Walgreens, or at the Fire Station. The members of the Waupun Fire Department are committed to helping fight hunger in the City of Waupun and surrounding communities and this event helps support the Waupun Food Pantry at a time of year where the demand is higher. Our corporate sponsors also play a big role in the success of this event. The Waupun Piggly

Wiggly has supported this event since year one, allowing us to have a truck there and donating a lot of food to the drive over the years. This year we are excited to also add the Waupun Walgreens and Waupun Culvers to the list. Walgreens will collect food during the month of October and will also have a truck there on the day of the event. Culvers has provided 500 ice cream cone cards for people making donations. The success of this event would not be possible without their continued support.

Since starting in 2009, this event has raised about \$5,800 and collected approximately 18,000 pounds of food. Once Firefighters wrap up the food drive, they begin prepping for their annual **"Change your clocks, change your batteries" event**. Anyone ordering a pizza for delivery from the Waupun Pizza Ranch on **November 1, from 5pm – 8pm**, has the option of having it delivered to their home in a fire truck. At that time, members of the Waupun Fire Department will inspect the smoke alarms in your house and provide up to 2 free batteries. Energizer and the International Association of Fire Chiefs (IAFC) have worked together for 27 years on the "Change your clocks, change your batteries" program.

Smoke alarms save lives and too often we find them with dead batteries or no batteries. Despite all the public service announcements out there, working smoke alarms, or lack thereof, continue to be an issue. Everyone must remember to test your smoke alarms monthly, change your batteries every six months, and replace smoke alarms every 10

years as they do go bad over time. Smoke alarms and CO detectors should also be installed on every level of your home. The Waupun Fire Department would like to thank the citizens of Waupun and local businesses for the many ways they support the department's initiatives. Working together we will build a safer community!

Leaf Management 101



1. Compost your leaves.

Mix leaves with other compostable items and spread it on your gardens next year.



2. Chop up leaves with your lawn mower.


Leaf fragments won't kill your grass, and this replaces one fertilizer application.

ANNUAL BUDDY POPPY CAMPAIGN BENEFITS NEEDY VETERANS

Members of Bentley-Hull Veterans of Foreign Wars (VFW) Post 6709, will be distributing Buddy Poppies in Waupun on Friday and Saturday, Oct. 24 & 25 at Waupun Piggly Wiggly, Holliday Food & Sports, Marshland Mobil and Waupun Citgo. According to Post Commander Frank Mesa, "VFW By-Laws require that the proceeds from our distribution of Buddy Poppies must be used to benefit disabled and needy veterans and the widows and orphans of deceased veterans right here in the community."

In 1923, the VFW was the first veterans organization to promote a nationally organized campaign for the annual distribution of Poppies assembled by disabled or hospitalized veterans. That tradition continues today, with more than 14 million Poppies assembled by paid, disabled and hospitalized veterans each year. The members of the VFW and its Ladies Auxiliary raise more than \$15 million annually from the distribution of Buddy Poppies.

The VFW, founded in 1899, is the nation's oldest major veterans organization with more than 1.9 million members.
