City Hall Happenings

2014: A YEAR IN REVIEW BY MAYOR KYLE

2014 was a development and event-filled year, highlighted with the celebration of our 175th anniversary. I am pleased to report that our community experienced new commercial, industrial, and retail business startups and expansions, adding new property value and jobs to the City of Waupun. Here is a summary of these developments:

MANUFACTURING: A new warehouse addition at **Flexographic Packaging**, producer of flexible packaging materials; and new addition and remodeling at **Federal-Mogul**, a world class manufacturing facility in our Business Park.

COMMERCIAL: A new 61 room **AmericInn Hotel** with lounge, pool, and breakfast area; a new **Jimmy John's** restaurant and **High Tails** pet supply store;

a major interior and exterior remodeling of the **Fox Valley Savings Bank**, and remodeling and addition at **Werner-Harmsen Funeral Home**. In our Business Park new construction and remodeling of an existing building for **Lamers Bus Lines**. Also, two 16-unit **Apartments** opened off Mayfair Street.

RETAIL: New small business start-ups **Thrivent Financial**, representative Jonathan Leonard; **The View Point**, repurposed and antique items; **Tattered - A Unique Boutique**, specializing in vintage, retro, industrial salvage,

antiques, and oddities; **Pretty Turtle Boutique**, handmade children's clothing, accessories and gifts; **End of the Trail Candy Shoppe**, addition for production and storage; **KLT Design**, website and graphic design agency; **Helen's Kitchen**, 3rd Generation owners.

We also continued to work with our business community improving our downtown, as we cleaned, tuck-pointed, and painted numerous properties in the 400 block of E. Main Street.



Bilingual Middle Manager Training on Employee Management

Effective employee management is a critical aspect of any successful agri-business. Developing the necessary management skills doesn't happen overnight, and they are difficult to achieve without some guidance. The challenge of training good managers is important to the profitability of any business.

The transition from employee to manager can be a tough road to navigate. In the two day bilingual workshop "How Prepared Are You?: Managing Dairy Employees Effectively" UW-Extension agents will share "people skills" with participants to help them be successful in their jobs. Topics will include personalities, communication, cultural barriers, managing conflict, behaviors and characteristics of a good leader, assertive management, trust and respect conducting performance reviews, and leadership through time management.

Workshops will be offered at three different locations: UW-Extension Marathon County, January 21 and 27; UW-Extension Fond du La County, February 4 and 11; and The Ravine, Green Bay, February 10 and 17.

The registration fee meeting is \$100 per person for the two-day workshop, \$90 per person for three individuals from the same farm. One day fee is \$60 person. Registration fee covers materials and meals. Registration is due one week prior to the meeting date.

The Lions Eye Bank of Wisconsin (LEBW) has awarded Waupun Lion Dr. Dean Lenz the “Knight of Sight Fellowship Award”. Waupun Lions Club President Jake Dittmann (on right) presented the award to Dr. Lenz at a recent meeting.

The Knight of Sight is the Lions Eye Bank of Wisconsin’s highest form of recognition presented to an individual by their club, zone, group or district. Recipients of the Knight of Sight Award exemplify the LEBW’s mission to give the Gift of Sight in Wisconsin, the United States, and internationally. Lenz’s name will be prominently and permanently displayed on the Lions Eye Bank of Wisconsin Knight of Sight Wall of Honor in Madison, Wisconsin.

The Lions Eye Bank serves as the central processing and coordination center for donated corneas. Donated corneas from throughout the state are transported to the Lions Eye Bank by Lions members throughout the state. After processing the corneas are again transported by Lions members from Madison to the various hospitals at which they are implanted in patients who are in need of them.

The name of the award stems from a speech made by Helen Keller at the 1925 Lions Club International Convention in Cedar Point, Ohio. Keller challenged the Lions to become her “knights of the blind in the crusade against darkness.” Lions International

readily took up Helen Keller's challenge, as evidenced by the establishment of outreaches such as the Lion Eye Bank of Wisconsin.

Dr. Lenz has dedicated his life to serving the vision related needs of people particularly in his local community. Dr. Lenz assumed the practice of his father, Dr. N. E. W. Lenz, serving the Waupun community from his office on Main Street in Waupun from 1962 through 2008. He also provided vision related services to inmates for thirty five years, serving inmates at Waupun, Dodge, Fox Lake and Columbia Correctional Institutions.

Dr. Lenz is the only remaining Charter Member of the Waupun Lions Club, maintaining continuous membership since 1962. As a Waupun Lion he provided vision screenings to Waupun residents, worked to provide large print books to the Waupun Library, served the Lions Eye Bank in various capacities including serving as a dispatcher for the Cornea Tissue Transport Program. Dr. Lenz stated that his major goal both professionally and as a member of the Waupun Lions Club and Lions Club International is to raise public awareness about good vision, and to make people aware of the services of the Lions Eye Bank. He encourages everyone to take steps to ensure that they are registered as organ donors in order to potentially give others the gift of sight through cornea transplants.
