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Waupun Recreation Board Minutes of Meeting February 23, 2015

The Waupun Recreation Board met Monday, February 23, 2015 at 6:00pm at the Waupun City Hall Council Chambers with Chairperson Rick Vant Hoff presiding.

Members present: Chairperson Rick VantHoff, Julie Nickel, Kelly Hraban, Mike Johnson, Des Hull, and Abby Buwalda.

Absent members: None

Also in attendance were Mayor Kyle Clark, Public Works Director Dick Flynn, City Clerk Angie Hull, Jen Kruel of the YMCA, and representatives from Hunters Safety, Gridiron, Hoopsters, Drift Jumpers, Hockey, Little League and WARP.

Motion by Nickel, second by Buwalda to approve the minutes of the following meetings: 1/26 Rec Board, 1/26 Joint Meeting of the Rec Board and Board of Public Works, and 2/11 Rec Board.

Youth Sports Budget Requests:

Hoopsters presented request for wireless scoreboards. Any amount will be appreciated. Athletic Department will pay half.

Gridiron presented request for 5th/6th grade tackle football. Playing area teams now. \$2,500.00. New helmets.

Hockey – 80 kids. Rental skates and new walkers. \$50 per pair. Youth size to men's sizes.

Drift Jumpers – Education program. 50 kids per year. \$10 fee for kids. Books, rental of hall. \$500 to put on program. Kids 12 years old. Every year fills up. \$10 covers cost of book.

Hunters Safety – 100 students per year. DNR recommends cut class size down to 30 kids instead of 50. Need more instructors. 6 instructors currently. Use personal equipment. DNR only allows them to charge \$10 per student.

Little League - \$1,000 for faucet. Total \$1,500. Ice cream. Ice cream machine instead of smoothie machine. Upgrade sink.

Pool Update:

- Flyer: Early bird special. Purchase by 4/15. Open/close days June 6 – September 7. 1-7pm. Trying it this year.
- June 3 class coming to swim. \$2 for students. Ice cream and slushies may be available for them.
- Get hours and dates on Fond du Lac County website for campers.
- Special education students – private swimming lessons. Call YMCA or pool manager. Skilled staff can do it, but may cost more.
- Special events:
 - o KEEP: Fathers Day, Reciprocal Days, Family Sundaes, Teen Nights (add Aug. 14 date 7-8pm)
 - o TAKE OUT: Waupun Days
- Shelter Rental – move from \$75 to \$25
- Water aerobics June 8-July 29. Free with daily pass or season pass.
- Swimming Lessons \$20 fee
- Swim Team \$25 fee. Need 5-6 kids.
- Concessions: healthier choices, Rick is helping with this
- Music: Only during water exercises
- Parking Lot: Mayor Kyle said might have more parking spots, he and Dick will talk to someone
- Safety:
 - o Slip mats in locker rooms – Jen will get quotes, construction funds available
 - o Paint edge in 0 inch water
 - o Adults to swim at rest period. No slides.
- Recycling:
 - o Rick will check with vendors on recycling
 - o Dick will have a crew come up each day
- Safety reasons for diving off of high dive, too shallow
- Bike racks – paid for by WARP, put together
- Staff – meeting 5/16, 8am-1pm, must be there
- Need to possibly take away parking spots for an emergency vehicle to get through. Open double gate doors. Need to stripe stalls.

- Free coffee
