NATIONAL LIBRARY WEEK PROGRAM

As part of National Library Week, Bret Jaeger, Director of the Waupun Public Library, presented "The Life of a Civil War Soldier" on Wednesday evening, April 15th. Jaeger, a Civil War Historian and re-enactor, shared a glimpse of what daily life was like for soldiers who served in the war that divided our nation. The presentation included artifacts of clothes the

soldier wore, personal gear they carried, weapons, food they ate, and the sacrifices the Civil War soldier made. Jaeger is shown wearing one of the uniforms and holding a 69-caliber 1865 musket. Jaeger's great-great-grandfather served in the Civil War.





Limited Medicare Coverage When Traveling Abroad

Whether visiting friends and family or exploring new exotic destinations, travel is something most people eagerly anticipate. However, it is advisable to check with one's insurance coverage before heading out on that next excursion.

Medicare coverage outside the U.S. is extremely limited. Outside the U.S. means anywhere other than the 50 states, District of Columbia, Puerto Rico, U.S. Virgin Islands, Guam, American Samoa, and Northern Mariana Islands. In most situations, Medicare will not cover medical services provided outside the U.S.

Medicare will, however, cover Medicare-covered services in foreign hospitals in 3 limited situations:

- 1) Individual is in the U.S. and experiences a medical emergency and the foreign hospital is closer than the nearest U.S. hospital that can treat the illness or injury.
- 2) Individual lives in the U.S. and the foreign hospital is closer to home than the nearest U.S. hospital that can treat the condition — regardless of whether it's an emergency.
- 3) Individual is traveling through Canada without an unreasonable delay by the most direct route between Alaska and another state when there is a medical emergency and the Canadian hospital is closer than the nearest U.S. hospital.

Foreign hospitals are not required to submit claims to Medicare for a patient. If someone receives services in a foreign hospital, they should submit a copy of that bill to Medicare for processing.

Medicare also covers medically necessary health care services received on a cruise ship when: 1) the doctor is allowed under law to provide medical services on the cruise ship, and 2) the ship is in a U.S. port or no more than 6 hours away from a U.S. port when services are received. Conversely, if the ship is more than 6 hours from a U.S. port, services will not be covered.

Medigap policies may offer additional coverage for medical services provided outside of the U.S. Some Medigap policies will provide foreign travel emergency health care coverage. Plans that do offer this type of coverage will typically pay 80% of the billed services after the yearly deductible is met. There are of course other limitations and exceptions to coverage with Medigap policies, so it important for travelers to check with their insurance agent before going abroad.

Medicare Advantage plans may also offer coverage for health care services provided outside of the U.S. Again, coverage may be limited, if it is available at all. Reviewing the yearly Summary of Benefits is advisable if a person is relying on an Advantage plan for international coverage.

Veterans or member of a veteran's family may have coverage outside of the U.S. Reimbursed medical care for U.S. veterans residing or traveling in Canada and other foreign countries, however, is typically limited to treatment for VA-rated, service-connected disabilities only. Nonetheless, there may be additional coverage through veteran's health insurance policies such as TRICARE.

Lastly, travel insurance is an option one should consider for medical coverage outside of the U.S. However, not all travel insurance includes health coverage. If an individual's only health insurance is Medicare, he or she may want to consider paying extra for this insurance before heading out on that next trip — unless traveling a direct route from his or her home state to Alaska.

What is Dementia?

Dementia is not a specific disease. It's an overall term that describes a set of symptoms associated with a decline in memory or other thinking skills severe enough to reduce a person's ability to carry out daily activities. Alzheimer's disease is the most common cause of progressive dementia.

When should I have a memory screen?

A memory screen is a wellness tool that helps identify possible changes in memory and cognition that may warrant further evaluation. Though a memory screen is not a diagnostic tool, it creates a baseline of where a person is today so that future changes can be monitored. So just as blood pressure, cancer, diabetes or stroke screenings contribute to prevention and better treatments, so do memory screens. If you are concerned about your memory and want to track your memory ability over time, you may want to consider an annual memory screen.

How can a Dementia Care Specialist help me?

The Dementia Care Specialist will assist in the development of Dementia Friendly Communities, which will include Dementia Friendly Businesses, increased Civic Awareness and more. If interested in a Memory Screen, you may schedule an appointment at the ADRC or watch for details on an opportunity to be offered at the Waupun Senior Center on Friday, June 30th. For concerns about a loved one, a care consultation, either in person or by phone, may assist you in developing a care plan to allow them to remain independent longer.

Who is a caregiver?

A caregiver is anyone providing physical, emotional, financial or other types of assistance to a family member or friend, who has a chronic disease or other conditions, which require ongoing attention.



Attention Parents with children from ages 3 - 5 (not in 4k or in kindergarten)

The Waupun Area School District can provide assistance to you if you have any concerns or questions regarding your child's speech/language, motor, self-care/independence, vision/hearing or social/emotional skills. The CHILD FIND service is provided at no charge to the parent, and all information gathered is confidential. Below are some signs that may be cause for concern. (Please remember one sign alone may not mean there is a problem.)

Areas of Focus:

Speech/Language skills: *how your child talks or understood when you or family member talks to them

- By age 3, cannot repeat simple rhymes or common musical jingles.
- By age 4, cannot say short, complete sentences.
- By age 5, can be understood only by those who are used to the child's speech habits.

Motor skills: *how your child plays with sports balls

*can your child put puzzles together

*can your child climb

*can your child draw

- Cannot walk up or downstairs or run without falling by age 3.
- Cannot balance on one foot or jump from a bottom step by age 4.
- Cannot turn somersaults by age 5.

Social skills: *how does your child play with other children

*can your child follow rules

- Does not play alone with toys by age 3.
- Is not able to play group games, or understand taking turns by age 4.
- Cannot play competitive games by age 5.

Self-care/independent skills: * can your child dress/undress themselves independently

*does your child follow daily routines

The Child's Sight

- Crosses one or both eyes.
- Eyelids are often red, watery, puffy, and encrusted.
- Often rubs eyes, as though they itch or hurt.
- Often complains that eyes hurt.

The Child's Hearing

- Does not turn toward sounds.
- Always turns the same ear in the direction of a sound.
- Talks very loudly, shouts during normal

If you are new to the school district and /or have concerns about your child's development, arrangements maybe made calling Linda Meagher at 324-9341 ext. 2117 at the Education Service Center for further information. After your child turns three, that child can be screened at any time prior to kindergarten.
