NEWS FROM THE SENIOR DEMOCRATIC SEMINAR CLASS

Senior Democratic Seminar (SDS) is a required class for all seniors in order to graduate at the Waupun Area Jr/ Sr High School. The course focuses on Service-Learning, and the Class of 2015 has chosen school improvement as their focus throughout the year. Service-Learning differs from volunteering, because it has a focus on education instead of manual labor. For example, picking up trash on the side of a highway is considered volunteering. It helps the community, but does not get to the heart of the problem. If instead of simply picking up trash, people were also taught about the dangers of littering and pollution, the same situation is considered service-learning.

Throughout the year, the SDS class did many projects to help improve the school. Below is a list of all the pro-

jects this class has worked on throughout the year:

- The first project of the year was getting a new volleyball court in the County Park.
- Our school has a new mascot that will be cheering on the athletes at sporting events.
- New recycling bins were acquired for the commons to help promote an environmentally friendly lifestyle.
- Students have been volunteering at the animal shelter, helping out the animals there.
- Trap shooting and a Bowling club were created to create more athletic activities for students to participate in.
- Three new water bottle filling stations were acquired for our school so students can stay hydrated and help save the environment by reusing bottles.
- Students helped raise money through candy cane sales and cookies to help families through the holiday season.
- A support group was created with the guidance counselors to help students deal with the stresses of high school life.
- There are new pictures in the athletic hallway showing off the history of Waupun athletics.
- A group of students helped to improve the school woods and to educate kids at SAGES about the dangers of invasive species.
- The bell from Rock River Intermediate school is currently being moved to the high school to keep up with the tradition of the bell being by the high school.
- A group of students went to Meadowview Primary, Rock River Intermediate school, and SAGES to tutor students.
- The currently unused

basketball hoops in the old Washington School building are in the process of being moved to the high school where they will be used.

- Money was fundraised through cream pop sales to help improve the Drama Club and the stage.
- A new mural was painted in the art pod to help improve the appearance of the school.
- During Black History month, students in the Jr High were taught about the the history of African Americans and the importance of celebrating the month.
- A coffee shop is currently being created in the library. It will be run by a combination of special education and regular education students to help learn life skills.
- A group of students went to Prairie Ridge nursing home to play games with residents and to help improve their quality of life.

- Students obtained a new “Yield for Pedestrians in Crosswalk” sign for the front of the high school to improve safety of students crossing the street.
- A new mural was painted in the school’s FITT Center to improve its appearance.
- The championships sign by Marine Credit Union was repainted to show

our athletic accomplishments.

- The school store is currently being moved to a new location in the library.
- A group of students



teamed up with veterans to put on the 50th anniversary of the Vietnam war event.

- Two new picnic tables were received as a gift from Waupun’s Taco Bell which allows students to eat outside.

The SDS class tackled many important projects throughout the year, and hopes to continue working to improve our school next year.
