Take a step back in time at Marsh Haven Nature Center during the weekend of September 25-27. The annual Fall Living History Festival welcomes re-enactors and artisans who will share their role in history and skills from the past. Tents and tipis will be set up for the encampment weekend at Marsh Haven Nature Center, W10145 Highway 49, three miles east of Waupun.

There will be educational and hands-on demonstrations indoors and outside, including: tomahawk throwing, Native American storytelling, Fox of the River Voyageur Canoe, War of 1812, blacksmithing, candle making, basket weaving, rug weaving, porcelain painting, Dutch Oven cooking, fiber arts, prairie garden, and Conestoga wagon display.

when school groups and homeschool families are invited to attend free of charge during the hours of 8:30 a.m.-2:30 p.m. The encampment is open to the public 9 a.m.-7 p.m. Saturday and 9 a.m.-3 p.m. on Sunday. Crafts and games for the children will be available.

**HOSPICE HOPE HONORS VETERANS**

When it was discovered that Lawrence Klosterman, 73, of Waupun was a veteran under the hospice program, Tim Guiden, a retired Air Force Colonel, now serving as an Agnesian Hospice Hope volunteer from Fond du Lac, presented Larry with a lapel pin that contained a blue star to honor those who have served our country. He was also presented with a forget-me-nots lap quilt with military themes. Larry proudly served five years in the Air Force with time spent in Africa during the Cuban Crisis.

Beginning in the First World War, many American homes proudly displayed "service flags" in their windows. This flag was designed by Captain Robert Queisser, 5<sup>th</sup> Ohio Infantry, who had two sons serving at the front

lines in Europe. It later became an official banner authorized by the Dept. of Defense. The flag was meant to be hung prominently in the windows of homes of family members of those serving.

Today, on behalf of a grateful nation, lapel pins are provided to those same family members. These lapel pins are the same design as the service flag and can be worn long after the service member is no longer in uniform.

## **Bulk Item Pick-up**

The Spring bulk item pick-up with Advanced Disposal Services will be held the week of October 5, 2015. Bulk items should be picked up on your normal trash pick-up date depending on the amount of items that are at the curb. Items may not be placed at the curb prior than 24 hours to your scheduled pick-up date. Below are guidelines for pick-up. Contact Advanced Disposal Services at 920-387-0987 with any questions.

The following items are identified as bulk waste that will be collected:

- Furniture
- Rolled carpeting (4ft maximum length)
- Cabinets
- Countertops
- Mattresses/bed springs
- Non-metal doors
- Wood windows
- Wooden playground equipment.

Excluded items:

- Uncontainerized or piles of construction material,
- Large appliances (stoves, washers, dryers, etc)
- Freon-containing items (refrigerators, AC units, freezers)
- Tires
- Batteries
- Fluorescent lights/bulbs
- TVs/DVD players/VCR
- Computer equipment
- Electronic Items banned from landfills.





# It's A Wonderful Life

## A Live Radio Play

**SOUND EFFECTS:** In the era of old time radio, sound effects were created by sound effects men and occasionally women. The sound effects technicians collected an enormous array of objects all used in the creation of live sound effects. While recorded effects were first used as early as 1928, most of the sounds heard were created live. It is suggested that the sounds be made in the most visual manner possible, as this adds an additional visual aspect to the production.

The numerous sound effect cues (indicated throughout the script by "SFX") create the mood and add detail to the play. These sound effects should be performed live by the actors. (Although some productions have chosen to employ a foley artist, the actors provide an additional visual element.)

What follows is a list of sound effects used in *It's a Wonderful Life: A Live Radio Play*. Please note that sounds used multiple times (i.e. door opens and shuts, etc) are only noted once. Some sounds also include notes on how these effects can be achieved:

Ice cracking	Corn flakes crushed on baking sheet or bamboo/wood being broken/peeled
Water sloshing	Bucket of water in basin of water
Door with/without bell opens and shuts/slams	Door on frame
Ice cream noises	Seltzer bottle, ice cream scooper in tin of water, candy jar lids open/closed
Opening up telegram	
Capsules falling to the floor	Jellybeans dropped onto baking sheet
Capsules being put back into glass bottle	Jellybeans placed into bottle
Gower slapping Young George	Belt (fold and snap)
Car horn	Period car horn

To simulate this effect, however, reverse the procedure this way: Secure a large wash tub or wooden tub. Fill it about 3/4 full of water. Get a bucket and sink it until it is full of water, then turn it over, but keep it submerged. With the bottom side up, yank sharply out of the tub.


