ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT NEWS

Is the next great entrepreneur among us? That's what a group of 50 high school students from six schools around the area set out to learn when they participated in *Entrepreneurship on Tour* on December 4, 2015. Among this group were 9 students from Waupun Area Junior/Senior High School. The City of Waupun recently joined the IGNITE! Business Success resource network and was a sponsor of the event.

Kathy Schlieve, Economic Development Planner for the City of Waupun, explained the significance of this type of event for our community, saying, "Healthy business startups are essential to enhancing the economic picture in Waupun and we were excited to be a sponsor of this event. The tour was the first in a series of events that are focused on encouraging our youth to explore what it means to own and operate a business in our community, while providing them with tools to pursue their own entrepreneurial passions." Currently, Wisconsin ranks 50th in the nation for the number of new businesses started each month and there is a major effort underway to educate youth at an early age to improve that position. Schlieve added, "Entrepreneurial success will contribute to the development of our local economy, creating jobs and adding wealth to enhance the quality of life for our residents."

As part of the day, students toured business locations in Waupun and the surrounding area. They then attended an event at Moraine Park Technical College where they heard a presentation on entrepreneurship from the inventors of *The Great Plate* as well as a panel discussion of three high school students who currently operate businesses.

Two of the students on the panel are current Waupun High School students. (Pictured below.) The final focus of the day had students participating in a Think Tank Challenge where they were encouraged to generate as many ideas as possible to solve real-world problems and learn how entrepreneurs use this process to create business opportunity.

IGNITE! representatives reached out to area high schools to better understand what would help drive the conversation with students. To an educator, tours rose to the top. Let students see and “touch” what it is like to run a business. Kris Beaver, Business Education/Agricultural Education Instructor from Waupun Area Junior/Senior High School shared the following about the *Entrepreneurship on Tour* event, “My experience with the IGNITE! program was inspiring. The real world knowledge that the students obtained that day was priceless. I have used the Entrepreneur challenge in class as an example and to challenge students. The advice that the business owners shared created a learning experience that cannot be duplicated. They related real life experiences that demonstrated how difficult being a business owner/entrepreneur can be.”

To say this was an eye opener to students is an understatement. Tiana Gaubatz from Waupun High School shared, “The IGNITE! program was an amazing experience and I would definitely want to do this again. I learned so much and found out a lot of the aspects of business. The seminar was an awesome experience and it was really fun to learn from the creator of *The Great Plate*, and I really liked the group activity and how we all found ways to fix our daily struggles. I would like to thank all the people who have given me this experience and I hope others can do this in the future.”

Students left the event with an invitation to participate in The Youth Idea Challenge in the spring of 2016. Think Shark Tank for youth entrepreneurs. Students at Waupun Area Junior/Senior High School are already working to develop and submit ideas to enter this competition.


