

Purple Martin 101: Help and Hints

Join Dick Nikolai, a retired wildlife biologist and master bird bander, as he discusses the basics on Purple Martins. Dick has been conducting ongoing research since 1985 on purple martins in Wisconsin, looking at site fidelity, cavity fidelity, longevity, pair fidelity, reproduction, weight, physical traits, types of housing success, and impacts of weather on weight. He will discuss the status of purple martins in Wisconsin, talk about failures of colonies, needs to be successful for attracting martins, and research with the use of banding. Weather permitting, Dick will capture some adult purple martins to discuss the physiology of these birds, and we will take a close-up look at Marsh Haven Nature Center's purple martin colony.



STH 49 will be closed from STH 68 to State Street.

Notices:

Reducing sources of moisture can reduce your need for dehumidification.

Improving the drainage around the foundation of your home may result in decreased humidity in your basement. Some ways to improve drainage are:

- Extend downspouts from your gutters away from the foundation of your home
- Keep gutters and downspouts clear and open
- Ensure that the soil slopes away from your foundation to avoid pooling of water near your home
- Avoid over-watering of foundation plantings

Ensure that clothes dryers are properly vented to the outdoors. If you do not use a clothes dryer, dry your clothes outdoors as opposed to hanging them inside for drying.

Use vent fans in bathrooms and kitchens to remove humidity at the source.

Repair leaking outdoor faucets. Not only will this help reduce humidity, but it will also save you money on your water bills!







Fond du Lac County Master Gardener Program

Spring has sprung, and gardens are growing. If you have questions about flowers, trees, fruits, vegetables, or insects contact the Master Gardener Volunteer Horticulture Help Line via email at master.gardener@uwc.edu or call 920/929-3171 from 8:00am - 4:30pm Monday through Friday. On Saturdays, you can hear Master Gardener Volunteers on the 1450 AM KFIZ radio program "Landscape Smart" with more gardening tips and discussion from 8am – 9am.

Becoming a Certified Master Gardener Volunteer with UW-Extension is something special. These gardeners have participated in the 13-week Level One training program and achieved at least a 70% score on the final exam. They also volunteer at least 24 hours per year (usually many more) to share what they've learned. Master Gardener Volunteers maintain their knowledge by participating in at least ten hours per year of educational programs on topics such as therapy gardens, herbs, shrubs, and plant diseases.

Master Gardener Volunteers are not only people who love to garden, they dedicate themselves to teaching others. In Fond du Lac County, they teach elementary students at Riverside, Parkside, Pier, Rosenow, and Sabish. They are preparing Veteran's Park in downtown Fond du Lac for the Memorial Day parade. They can be found in the Columbus Park Butterfly Garden in Campbellsport, the Sisson Peony Garden in Rosendale, the Free Spirit Riders Sensory Garden in the Town of Empire, and Waupun Community Gardens. They adapt methods to incorporate students with disabilities and inmates into the activities.

The Master Gardener program is sanctioned by the Land Grant institutions in each state, and has been sponsored by the University of Wisconsin – Extension since 1970. There are currently 65 Certified Master Gardener Volunteers in Fond du Lac County and 2844 in Wisconsin. 
