NEWS RELEASE FROM THE CHRISTIAN HOME

Agnesian HealthCare, Christian Home sign letter of intent

It's been a partnership four years in the making, and thanks to many successes, mutual respect, and shared mission and values, the Christian Home and Rehabilitation Center, Inc. and Agnesian HealthCare are taking these efforts to the next level. Both organizations have announced they have signed a non-binding letter of intent to evaluate the completion of a formal affiliation between the Christian Home & Rehabilitation Center, Christian Living Center and Christian Homestead, and Agnesian HealthCare. Signing a non-binding letter of intent will enable the Christian Home Board of Directors and Agnesian HealthCare to evaluate and work toward transferring the facilities over to Agnesian HealthCare. The focus of such an affiliation will be to ensure that Waupun and surrounding communities have access to quality nursing home and rehabilitation services, enhance the collaboration with Waupun Memorial Hospital and determine improved facility development needs in the future. In March 2012, the Christian Home and Agnesian HealthCare started a management and services agreement to aid the Christian Home Board of Directors with carrying out the mission of the organization. Under the agreement Agnesian HealthCare - utilizing expertise from its St. Francis Home skilled nursing and rehabilitation services - assumed day-to-day management of the Christian Home and Rehabilitation Center. "Our partnership with Agnesian HealthCare has brought forward the resources we need to ensure the continued growth and sustainability of these important services within the Waupun community," according to Susan Buwalda, the Christian Home and Rehabilitation Center Board of Directors chairperson. "Yet, we know there is much more that we want to accomplish to expand our offerings to residents and their families, and Agnesian HealthCare has the broader expertise to help us achieve this mission." It was in 1940 that representatives from the Reformed and Christian Reformed churches gathered to examine how to provide care for the elderly in the Waupun community. Their vision became a reality in 1954, and since that time, its staff has faithfully served to meet the physical, spiritual and emotional needs of residents. The Christian Home and Rehabilitation Center has been providing long-term care, rehabilitation services, memory care, and assisted living apartments to individuals and families. "Both the Christian Home and Rehabilitation Center and Agnesian HealthCare have a long history of providing quality care to individuals and families in the Waupun area," according to Steve Little, Agnesian HealthCare president and chief executive officer. "This next step provides both organizations the opportunity to collaborate even more closely as faith-based ministries, and to strengthen the services we offer to older adults and their families." It will also help the Christian Home and Rehabilitation Center to effectively evaluate existing facilities needs that will ensure its future viability. A capital campaign has been underway to raise \$3 million to build a new 50-bed skilled care facility and modern, state-of-the-art rehabilitation center on a 10-acre site near the Christian Homestead facility on West Brown Street. The anticipated cost for the project is \$13 million. However, despite aggressive efforts, the campaign is falling short of that goal, raising \$1 million to date. Fund-raising efforts will continue and the Christian Home Board of Directors is still counting on the community to provide for the needs of Waupun's elderly. "We truly appreciate how much the community has supported our organization, but at the same time, we recognize we cannot do this on our own," Buwalda says. "That's where we hope that by reaching out to Agnesian HealthCare that we can sustain our organization for generations to come. That's all part of what we will be exploring during the upcoming months." In addition, challenges continue with managing an outdated facility which requires continuous repairs, rising health insurance costs, labor costs associated with staff recruitment and retention, technology needs, as well as the growing complexities of running a business. Looking to a more definitive partnership with Agnesian HealthCare will also help this small freestanding care facility flourish in a highly-competitive environment where long-term care needs will only continue to grow. "Breaking advances in medicine have extended life expectancy significantly over the last generation," according to Buwalda. "At the same time, the methods and quality of care for our residents has also become more diverse and of higher quality. "Over the past decade, the board of the Christian Home has strengthened our operation and today we are looking toward the future," Buwalda adds. "It's now our turn to step up like the founders did to maintain the heritage of meeting the needs of our residents and as an asset to our community." A strategic partnership between both two organizations is a positive move for both, according to Little. "The mission, values and visions of both of our ministries are very complementary. This potential partnership will reinforce our commitment to not-for-profit healthcare, and allow us to expand our services and expertise across this rural area."



Recipients of the Knight of Sight Award exemplify the LEBW's mission to give the Gift of Sight in Wisconsin, the United States, and internationally. The name of Homan Auto Sales of Waupun will be prominently and permanently displayed on the Lions Eye Bank of Wisconsin Knight of Sight Wall of Honor in Madison, Wisconsin.

The Lions Eye Bank serves as the central processing and coordination center for donated corneas. Donated corneas from throughout the state are transported to the Lions Eye Bank by Lions members throughout the state. After processing the corneas are again transported by Lions members from Madison to the various hospitals at which they are implanted in patients who are in need of them.

The name of the award stems from a speech made by Helen Keller at the 1925 Lions Club International Convention in Cedar Point, Ohio. Keller challenged the Lions to become her "knights of the blind in the crusade against darkness." Lions International readily took up Helen Keller's challenge, as evidenced by the establishment of outreaches such as the Lion Eye Bank of Wisconsin.



Homan Auto was nominated for this award by the membership of the Waupun Lions Club in recognition of Homan Auto's commitment to the support of the Waupun Lions Club throughout the years. 

New Literacy Program Shows Promise in Waupun

"Increasing achievement in reading and writing has become a primary focus in the Waupun Area School District," says superintendent Tonya Gubin. During 2015-16, teachers at Meadow View Primary School and Rock River Intermediate School studied Partnerships in Comprehensive Literacy (PCL), a model developed by Linda Dorn from the University of Arkansas, Little Rock. "We are confident in this model because it is grounded in theory and research," says Judith Hoepfner, Director of Teaching and Learning. An essential component of the PCL involves literacy coaches who demonstrate how to reinforce literacy concepts and skills across subject areas in model classrooms. Darcy Schobert-Bethke and Tara Caul serve as literacy coaches. This past year, model classroom teachers opened their classrooms to other teachers who observed how mentor texts are used during Language Workshop, Reading Workshop, and Writing Workshop; how "Thoughtful Logs" reinforce student learning; and how frequent teacher-student conferences take place. Both fiction and informational books and articles are used to reinforce student understanding of vocabulary, comprehension, fluency, writing, and problem-solving skills. In speaking about the impact of the model, reading specialist Darcy Schobert-Bethke said, "I have never seen something make such a difference!" During 2016-17, the focus on Partnerships in Comprehensive Literacy will expand to include grades 6-12. This summer over two dozen educators and administrators attended the Summer PCL Institute and heard literacy experts Linda Dorn, Carla Soffos, Adria Klein, Marcia Nye Boody, and Michelle Amend.



Construction Update STH 49 Project – Waupun, WI for the week of August 29, 2016



SAFETY 1st:

- **Please slow down in and around the work zone**
- **REMINDER: A road construction project makes a very dangerous but attractive playground for children. Please warn them of the dangers and please keep them clear of the construction area.**
- **Expect construction traffic entering and leaving the work zone. Trucks will be entering and leaving the closed roadway for work operations.**
- **STH 49 will be closed from County Park Road to State Street.**

Notices:

- The Stage 1 portion of the STH 49 project is scheduled to be opened to traffic by the end of the day on August 31, 2016. Please be aware of the traffic change on that date. Garbage pickup will remain on Mondays, however, residents are asked to put their bins out on Sunday evening. During times when garbage truck access is restricted, the City of Waupun crews will be moving bins to the nearest side street for pickup and returning them to properties after pickup is completed. If you want your exact bins back, please write your address on them.
- If weather permits, crews will be working the new Harris Creek box culvert on Saturday August 27, 2016.
Please see the attached letter for information regarding the newly seeded lawns throughout Stage 1.

Closures

- Stage 1 and 2 traffic pattern will be in effect throughout the project through 8/31/16. State Street, West Street, and County Park Road will remain open to cross traffic. The closure of County Park Rd. is tentatively scheduled to begin in early September. Watch for message boards with exact dates for the closure.
- Stage 1 and 2 of STH 49 is closed to through traffic, however, local traffic maintains access to STH 49. Stage 1 is scheduled to re-open on 8/31/16 by the end of the day.

- The Stage 1 and 2 Alternate Business Route will be posted to assist local traffic around the project. This route has been modified to now include VerHage Road. After 8/31/16 the Stage 1 Alternate Business Route will be removed and only the Stage 2 route will remain.
- STH 49 thru traffic will be detoured on CTH M and CTH TC for the duration of the project.

Work Operations

- During the week of 8/29/16 water main and sanitary main services will be completed from West St. to Harris Ave. If your service is disrupted with prior notification please contact me at r.arndt@gremmerassociates.com
- Crews are scheduled to complete the final concrete work on the replacement of the Harris Creek box culvert. Harris Creek will revert to its original channel and the temporary bypass channel will be removed.
- Crews will be completing the new traffic signals at the Beaver Dam/Brandon St. intersection. The final pavement markings will be completed throughout Stage 1. Crews will complete final cleanup throughout Stage 1.
- Crews will also continue installing storm sewer between County Park Road and West St. Crews will begin roadway excavation from West St. to County Park Road



Message

from the Superintendent:

Welcome to another edition of Warrior Words, a newsletter about your greatest investment—our community's children!

This spring we were notified that the District received an additional \$677,990 in state aid. This money is not additional budget money for us. Instead, this money is deducted from the total tax levy which means a decrease in the school portion of your property taxes. Last year's school tax rate was \$10.35 per \$1,000 of equalized value and is projected to fall to \$9.65.

Referendum? I hope this word comes as no surprise to you! The District has been working on our facilities plan for over fifteen months. To recap, our high school, which was opened in 2000, will be paid off, and interest rates are at an all-time low. This scenario gives WASD a prime opportunity to do safety upgrades, take care of deferred maintenance items, and remodel our schools to prepare our students for careers not even thought of yet! Because of strategic long-range planning, we are able to do this with no property tax increase above the current debt service. All information regarding the facilities planning is available in detail on our website under "Facilities Planning" on the drop-down menu of the District tab on our homepage. <http://www.waupun.k12.wi.us/district/facilitiesplanning.cfm>

The Board of Education and I will be scheduling meetings around the community to answer questions and communicate further about the referendum question which will appear on the November ballot. I hope to see you there!

FACILITIES PLANNING UPDATE

Facility planning in the Waupun Area School District began in the spring of 2015. During the 2015-16 school year, the Facility Advisory Committee (FAC) was formed and completed thorough evaluations of all schools in the District to prioritize facility needs. As a result of the work they completed, the FAC was able to create a comprehensive Base Plan to improve District facilities and best position WASD for the future. The plan addressed both maintenance, infrastructure and programming needs at each school. The FAC tested community support for this plan through a community-wide survey, distributed in the Spring.

Using the feedback from the community survey, the FAC presented their recommendations to the School Board. Although the Base Plan presented in the survey received high levels of support with 57% of residents in favor, the FAC recommended pursuing options that would bring the plan to tax neutral. Small reductions to the plan presented in the survey would allow for the district facilities to receive significant upgrades while minimizing the effect on area taxpayers. Additionally, the committee decided to recommend not pursuing the construction of a new auditorium. This project was proposed as a second question in

addition to the base plan, but it didn't receive enough support from Waupun Area residents.

The survey data collected from the community and the recommendations from the FAC will help guide the Board in making the final decision on what to present to voters for a potential facilities referendum on November 8, 2016.

ANNUAL NOTICE HOMELESS CHILDREN

The McKinney-Vento Act defines children and youth who are homeless (twenty-one years of age and younger) as:

- Children and youth who lack a fixed, regular, and adequate nighttime residence, and includes children and youth who are:
 - sharing the housing of other persons due to loss of housing, economic hardship, or a similar reason (sometimes referred to as double-up);
 - living in motels, hotels, trailer parks, or camping grounds due to lack of alternative adequate accommodations;
 - living in emergency or transitional shelters;
 - abandoned in hospitals, or
 - awaiting foster care placement.
- Children and youth who have a primary nighttime residence that is a public or private place not designated for, or ordinarily used as, a regular sleeping accommodation for human beings.
- Children and youth who are living in cars, parks, public spaces, abandoned buildings, substandard housing, bus or train stations, or similar settings.
- Migratory children who qualify as homeless because they are living in circumstances described above.

If you are personally aware of or are acquainted with any children who may qualify according to the above criteria, the Waupun Area School District provides the following assurances to parents of homeless children:

- The local district staff person (liaison) for homeless children is Wendi Dawson, Director of Student Services, (920) 324-9341 ext. 2188 and wdawson@waupun.k12.wi.us.
- There shall be immediate enrollment and school participation, even if educational and medical records and proof of residency are not available.
- All educational opportunities and related opportunities for homeless students (preschool to age 21), including unaccompanied youth, shall be the same as for the general student population.
- Enrollment and transportation rights, including transportation to the school of origin. "School of origin" is defined as the school the child or youth attended when permanently housed or the school in which the child or youth was last enrolled.
- Written explanation of a child or youth's school placement, other than school of origin or the school requested by the parent, with the right to appeal within the local dispute resolution process.
- Meaningful opportunities for parents to participate in the education of their children. These shall include: special notices of events, parent-teacher conferences, newsletters, and access to student records.

PUBLIC NOTIFICATION OF NON DISCRIMINATION POLICY

NATIONAL SCHOOL LUNCH AND BREAKFAST PROGRAMS, SPECIAL MILK PROGRAM

The following household size and income criteria will be used for determining eligibility. Children from families whose annual income is at or below the levels shown are eligible for free and reduced price meals or free milk if a split-session student does not have access to the school lunch or breakfast service.

Application forms are being sent to all homes with a notice to parents or guardians. To apply for free or reduced price meals or free milk, households must fill out the application and return it to the school (unless notified at the start of the school year that children are eligible through direct certification). Additional copies are available at the office in each school. The information provided on the application will be used for the purpose of determining eligibility and may be verified at any time during the school year by agency or other program officials. Applications may be submitted at any time during the year.

To obtain free or reduced price meals or free milk for children in a household where one or more household members receive FoodShare, FDPIR, or Wisconsin Works (W-2) cash benefits, list the household member and the FoodShare, FDPIR or W-2 case number, list the names of all school children, sign the application, and return it to the school office.

For the school officials to determine eligibility for free or reduced price meals or free milk of households not receiving FoodShare, FDPIR or W-2 cash benefits, the household must provide the following information requested on the application: names of all household members and the adult signing the application form must also list the last four digits of his or her

Social Security Number or mark the box to the right of "Check if no SSN". Also, the income received by each household member must be provided by amount and source (wages, welfare, child support, etc.).

Under the provisions of the free and reduced price meal and free milk policy Waupun Area School District's designee, Taher, Inc. will review applications and determine eligibility. If a parent or guardian is dissatisfied with the ruling of the official, he/she may wish to discuss the decision with the determining official on an informal basis. If the parent/guardian wishes to make a formal appeal, he/she may make a request either orally or in writing to: Carrie Hintze, Director of Business Services, 950 Wilcox St., Waupun, WI 920-324-9341.

If a hearing is needed to appeal the decision, the policy contains an outline of the hearing procedure.

If a household member becomes unemployed or if the household size changes, the family should contact the school. Such changes may make the household eligible for reduced price meals or free meals or free milk if the household income falls at or below the levels shown above, and they may reapply at that time. Children formally placed in foster care are also eligible for free meal benefits. Foster children may be certified as eligible without a household application. Households with foster children and non-foster children may choose to include the foster child as a household member, as well as any personal income available to the foster child, on the same application that includes their non-foster children.

The information provided by the household on the application is confidential. Public Law 103-448 limits the release of student free and reduced price school meal eligibility status to persons directly connected with the administration and enforcement of federal or state educational programs. Consent of the parent/guardian is needed for other purposes such as waiver of text book fees.

Non-discrimination Statement:

In accordance with Federal civil rights law and U.S. Department of Agriculture (USDA) civil rights regulations and policies, the USDA, its Agencies, offices, and



 ANNUAL NOTICE OF SPECIAL
 EDUCATION REFERRAL AND
 EVALUATION PROCEDURES**

Upon request, the Waupun Area School District is required to evaluate a child for eligibility for special education services. A request for evaluation is known as a referral. When the district receives a referral, the district will appoint an Individualized Education Program (IEP) team to determine if the child has a disability, and if the child needs special education services. The district locates, identifies, and evaluates all children with disabilities who are enrolled by their parents in private (including religious) schools, elementary schools and secondary schools located in the school district.

A physician, nurse, psychologist, social worker, or administrator of a social agency who reasonably believes a child brought to him or her for services is a child with a disability has a legal duty to refer the child, including a homeless child, to the school district in which the child resides. Before referring the child, the person making the referral must inform the child's parent that the referral will be made.

Others, including parents, who reasonably believe a child is a child with a disability may also refer the child, including a homeless child, to the school district in which the child resides.

Referrals must be in writing and include the reason why the person believes the child is a child with a disability. A referral may be made by contacting Wendi Dawson, Director of Special Education, Waupun Area School District, at 920-324-9341, or by writing her at 950 Wilcox St., Waupun, WI 53963.

**WAUPUN AREA SCHOOL DISTRICT
 ANNUAL ASBESTOS
 NOTIFICATION**

(June 30, 2016)

As a result of the federal law AHERA (Asbestos Hazard Emergency Response Act) all primary and secondary schools are required to develop and implement a plan for managing all building materials which contain asbestos. Included in the AHERA Act is the requirement to notify all parents, guardians, and staff members, as well as organizations representing them, of activities and events with the asbestos containing building materials annually.

Asbestos has been used in many building materials due to its outstanding insulating and strengthening properties. When asbestos is undisturbed or intact, it poses little hazard to human health. It is only when damage has or may occur that the quality of the school's management program becomes an issue.

In 1988, all buildings owned, leased, or "under the control of" the School District were inspected by EPA accredited inspectors, with building material samples analyzed by an independent laboratory. Based on the inspection, the School District prepared and the state approved a comprehensive management plan for administering the asbestos located within its buildings, safely and responsibly.

Once every three years, certified inspectors must re-inspect remaining materials. In addition, the rule requires a periodic walk-through (called "surveillance") in each area containing asbestos every six months.

Short-term workers (outside contractors e.g. telephone repair workers, electricians, etc.) must be provided information regarding the location of asbestos in which they may come into contact. All short-term workers shall contact the lead maintenance person before commencing work.

During the past year the district has not abated any asbestos materials. Only minor floor tile maintenance or replacements have taken place throughout the district.

The School District also requires that all new building materials introduced in the School District are free from asbestos. For all new buildings/additions, the architect responsible for the design certifies that to the best of their knowledge, no asbestos containing materials are used. If new buildings are acquired, they too will be inspected.

The School District has a list of the location(s) and type(s) of asbestos containing materials found in the building and a description and timetable for their proper management. A copy of the Asbestos Management Plan is available for review in the School District office as well as individual school offices. Copies are available at the School District Office at a cost of twenty-five (25) cents per page. Our goal is to be in full compliance with AHERA. It is our policy to maintain a safe and healthful environment for our students and our staff members. This shall be accomplished by strict enforcement of the policies regarding asbestos by the asbestos manager and the school officials.




