BULK PICK-UP / YARD WASTE PICK-UP

Bulk Item Pick-up

The Fall bulk item pick-up with Advanced Disposal Services will be held the week of October 10, 2016. Bulk items should be picked up on your normal trash pick-up date depending on the amount of items that are at the curb. Items may not be placed at the curb prior than 24 hours to your scheduled pick-up date. Below are guidelines for pick-up. Contact Advanced Disposal Services at 920-387-0987 with any questions.

The following items are identified as bulk waste that will be collected:

- Furniture
- Rolled carpeting (4ft maximum length)
- Cabinets
- Countertops
- Mattresses/bed springs
- Non-metal doors
- Wood windows
- Wooden playground equipment.

Excluded items:

- Uncontainerized or piles of construction material,
- Large appliances (stoves, washers, dryers, etc)
- Freon-containing items (refrigerators, AC units, freezers)
- Tires
- Batteries
- Fluorescent lights/bulbs
- TVs/DVD players/VCR
- Computer equipment
- Electronic Items banned from landfills.

Yard Waste Pickup

The City of Waupun Department of Public Works will begin the Fall yard waste pickup service on October 17, 2016 and will continue through November 21, 2016 (weather permitting). This service is for the disposal of leaves, grass, garden waste, and branches that are generated from routine yard maintenance.

Please note the following guidelines:

- Leaves and brush shall **not** be deposited on the street
- Leave grass clippings and leaves at the curbside loose. **Please Do Not Bag.**
- Separate leaf piles and brush piles.
- Branches shall not exceed 3 inches in diameter
- No tree stumps or tree root systems will be collected.

The service is not intended for tree removal or lot cleaning.

The City will not collect any items not in compliance with the above guidelines. Thank you for your cooperation.

Vote November 8!**

After over a year of facilities planning and community input, the Waupun Area School District has finalized one referendum question for the November 8, 2016 General Election. The proposed \$36 million referendum would fund high priority facilities improvements at all four schools with no estimated tax increase above the current level due to retirement of existing debt.


Understanding the Proposed Project

The proposed referendum addresses some of the most significant challenges facing the District in each of our schools. Highlights include:

- Addressing aging infrastructure needs such as roof repairs, mechanical and electrical system updates, window replacements, fire alarm system and lighting upgrades, plumbing and resolving Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) code compliance issues
- Creating secure main entrances and improving parking lots for safer student drop off/pick up
- Building additions and expanding and/or renovating classroom areas including Tech Ed, Agriculture/Greenhouse, and Special Education to improve flexibility and facilitate college/ career readiness experiences
- Building a track, soccer field, and tennis courts at the Junior/Senior High School







VFW BUDDY POPPY CAMPAIGN



Members of the Veterans of Foreign Wars (VFW) Post 6709-Bentley-Hull will be distributing Buddy Poppies on October 14 & 15 at Piggly Wiggly, Citgo Gas Station, Holiday Food & Sports and Marshland Mobil. According to Post Commander, Frank Mesa, "VFW By-Laws require that the proceeds from our distribution of Buddy Poppies must be used to benefit disabled and needy veterans and the widows and orphans of deceased veterans right here in the community".

In 1923, the VFW was the first veterans organization to promote a nationally organized campaign for the annual distribution of Poppies assembled by disabled or hospitalized veterans. That tradition continues today, with more than 14 million Poppies assembled by paid, disabled and hospital veterans each year. The members of the VFW and its Ladies Auxiliary raise more than \$15 million annually from the distribution of Buddy Poppies.



Referendum Fact Sheet

What will be on the ballot Tuesday, November 8, 2016?

One referendum question requesting permission to borrow funds not to exceed \$36,000,000 to:


- Address **aging infrastructure, safety, security, and accessibility** at all four Waupun Area School District schools. These projects include creating secure main entrances, mechanical system upgrades (heating/ventilation/controls), window replacement, roof repairs and parking lot improvements among other projects.
- Improve **educational environments** at all schools, including renovating classrooms, creating flexible learning environments, ensuring age-appropriate facilities, upgrading cafeterias and gymnasiums, and building a new track, soccer field, and tennis courts at the Jr./Sr. High School.

Total project costs include renovations, construction, energy efficiency upgrades, building system replacements and repairs, site work, furnishings, fixtures and equipment, professional services fees, and required permits.

Why propose this plan now?

- Addresses high priority facility needs related to aging schools and building systems past their useful life while being fiscally responsible and good stewards of taxpayers' funds.
- Provides safe, warm, dry and accessible schools for all students and broad community use throughout the year.
- Creates learning environments that facilitate college and career-readiness and support the district's unique programs designed to advance agriculture, business, manufacturing, human services and technology.
- Maximizes the retirement of existing debt from the construction of the J/S High School nearly 20 years ago to address today's districtwide facility needs without increasing taxes above the current level for debt service.
- Responds directly to community input provided by the 17-member volunteer Facilities Advisory Committee and the 1,206 completed community-wide surveys.

Debt from the construction of the Junior/Senior High School in 1998 will soon be retired. As a result, the district can borrow \$36 million to address district facility needs without an increase above the 2015-2016 debt service levy. Construction Update STH 49 Project – Waupun, WI for the week of September 26, 2016



SAFETY 1st:

- **Please slow down in and around the work zone**
- **REMINDER: A road construction project makes a very dangerous but attractive playground for children. Please warn them of the dangers and please keep them clear of the construction area.**
- **Expect construction traffic entering and leaving the work zone. Trucks will be entering and leaving the closed roadway for work operations.**
- **STH 49 will be closed from County Park Road to State Street.**

Notices:

- Garbage pickup will remain on Mondays, however, residents are asked to put their bins out on Sunday evening. During times when garbage truck access is restricted, the City of Waupun crews will be moving bins to the nearest side street for pickup and returning them to properties after pickup is completed. If you want your exact bins back, please write your address on them.
- There will be workers sawing the newly placed concrete pavement at various hours throughout the night on days that concrete paving occurs. The timing of sawing is dependent on weather and daily production and normally must be done at night to prevent uncontrolled cracking of the new concrete.
- There will be crews working Saturday September 24, 2016 trimming the roadway aggregate to its final grade prior to next week's paving.

Closures

- Stage 2 traffic pattern will be in effect throughout the project. West Street, and Harris Avenue will remain open to cross traffic. The closure of County Park Rd. has been completed. The County Park Road intersection has re-opened to cross traffic, the Harris Ave. intersection will be closed again until concrete pavement is completed through the intersection. The West St. intersection will close late in the week, watch the message boards for a specific closure date. The West St. closure will last for a

maximum of 7 days to complete the concrete paving in the intersection. This will be the final closure of West St.

- Stage 2 of STH 49 is closed to through traffic, however, local traffic maintains access to STH 49.
- The Stage 2 Alternate Business Route has been posted to assist local traffic around the project. This route has been modified to now include VerHage Road.
- STH 49 thru traffic will be detoured on CTH M and CTH TC for the duration of the project.

Work Operations

Crews have begun mainline concrete pavement throughout Stage 2, and completed the eastbound lane from Johnson St. to west of West St. on Friday 9/23/16.

During the week of 9/26/16 crews are scheduled to complete the final mainline concrete paving in both lanes from Johnson St. through County Park Rd. Please take care to stay off of the fresh concrete. Damaged concrete will need to be replaced and will slow the project progress. Crews will also complete the concrete paving in the STH 68 and West St. intersections throughout the week.


