WAUPUN, Wis. April 16, 2020 – In response to the COVID-19 pandemic here are the latest updates from the City of Waupun.

Earlier today, Governor Evers extended the Safer at Home Order from April 24, 2020 to May 26, 2020 at 8:00AM or until a superseding order is issued.

The order has new measures to ensure continued safety but also allows certain activities to start.
