

When: Thursday at 9:00am AND 10:00am, No Yoga Stretch on Thursday, October 25.


FRIDAY FITNESS




QUICK READ BOOK CLUB

TRANSPORTATION

We can take you anywhere within the city limits of Waupun with the exception of the laundromat or pet-related places. We can take you to doctor appointments, hair appointments, grocery shopping, to restaurants, to banks, to the library, to anywhere! Transportation for ages 60+ within the city limits of Waupun. Multiple stops can be scheduled in 15-minute or more increments. Riders must be able to navigate two steps safely to board the vehicle. Van can seat up to nine passengers. **Cost:** \$1.00 each stop. Rides must be scheduled the day before by noon by calling 324-7930. Rides can be scheduled as early as 9:00am. The last non-medical ride is at 2:00pm and the last medical ride appointment is at 3:00pm.

MOBILE MEALS

The purpose of the mobile meal program is to provide one nutritionally balanced hot meal for five days per week on a temporary or permanent basis to homebound individuals. To be eligible to receive delivered mobile meals, individuals must be 60 years of age or older or married to someone 60 years of age or over, be frail or homebound, unable to cook for themselves or have someone in home to assist them in cooking. For eligibility and assessment each individual will receive a home visit by Fond du Lac County Department of Senior Services. To see if you or someone you know is eligible please call 920-929-3113. This service is brought to us by Fond du Lac County Department of Senior Services. Residents of Dodge County are also eligible within the city limits of Waupun.
