From the Waupun Mayor -

Hi Everyone!

I was asked to write a few updates for this week's column, so here it goes.

Rail Road: The rail road crossing at Main street is scheduled to be repaired next Summer. DPW Director Danne has done a nice job working with the rail road to get this scheduled. It's going to be a big project and require about a four-day detour of Main St. Stay tuned for updates as we get closer....

Communication: the Action Advertiser no longer exists, so I'm trying to do my best to keep people informed. I personally write this column every week, I'm out in the community as much as possible answering questions, and I try to get on the radio, too. I would recommend the Daily Citizen and Waupun Pioneer News for information. They're two media sources who cover Waupun.

There is also a Waupun Municipal Government Facebook Page and now an official Mayor's page. The previous Mayors Facebook page was a personal page and not owned by the city. The previous mayor killed that page on the afternoon I took office. I decided the city should own the "Mayor's Page" so that in future transitions the new mayor doesn't have to start from scratch with the page. It also helps with succession, meaning if something happens to me, the new mayor will have immediate access to the Mayor's Page.

Garbage: Last week I signed a new garbage contract! The new service is scheduled to begin in January, however, if things continue to be a struggle with our current garbage situation we may try to change sooner. As for the garbage, they're often behind on recyclables. Please leave the recycling container out, they usually come back around for it. And, make sure yours is out there by 7am! If the truck drives by before your can goes out, you've missed out! And sometimes garbage items fall out of the garbage truck, instead of calling city hall, please walk out and pick up lost trash and throw it away. Together, we can keep Waupun cleaner.

Child Care: This issue is big and continues to be a problem in our region. Daycares struggle with staffing, and parents struggle for a quality place for their kiddos while they work. We continue to work with the existing daycare to hopefully expand, and are exploring options to bring in another child care center.

After School Program: The after-school care program was a joint adventure between Wee Care and the Waupun School District. I had nothing to do with it and didn't know the program was ending until all the emails started pouring in. For questions and concerns about the after-school program please contact your school board member. Waupun Community Fund: I'm really excited this group is now up and running. We just announced the fund's first big donation and project, (Cemetery/Shaler Park improvements) and we're on the verge of announcing a second. Stay tuned!

Prisoners in the Park: I learned this week that when the line to drop off new inmates at DCI is long, and the incoming inmate needs to use the restroom, the transportation officers drive the inmate to Dodge Park. This usually isn't an issue, except that we have a Summer Park Program going on there, so we have a park full of kiddos, and then a van shows up, armed officers hop out, and then escort a hand cuffed and shackled inmate through the park to use the bathroom. I have talked with the warden and we're working towards a better solution than escorting inmates through a park full of kids.

City of Sculpture: I feel strongly that the Shaler statues make Waupun unique, are our top cultural asset, and can help drive people to Waupun. For that reason, I campaigned hard to return our branding to be "City of Sculpture or Wisconsin's Sculpture City." I was even willing to pay for the updates to the way finding signage myself, so that the End of the Trail would be on the sign instead of the corn leaf logo.

I lost. I worked really hard for it, but in the end the council unanimously disagreed with me. Somehow my effort got tagged as being racially incentive, and I spent much of the past three weeks explaining to people that I don't hate Indians. That was frustrating, but I guess this is how it is.

Breast Feeding: We took a complaint at city hall about a woman who was breast feeding her baby at the Farmer's Market. While I understand it might not be what you expect to see, moms are protected by law to feed their babies, and as Mayor I will support a women's right to breast feed if she chooses.

Senior Center: We're finally making good progress here. The council authorized the creation of an Ad Hoc committee that I will be appointing people to. The senior center was the biggest goal of Mayor Nickel and I will make sure that we honor that in some way at the new building. This will be a wonderful addition for our community.

Current Taxes Due: Current year property taxes due. The 2021 property tax bills were mailed December 2021 and a minimum payment, equal to the first installment, was due by January 31, 2022. Second installment(s) are considered Postponed Taxes and are due July 31, 2022. If the required installment amount due is not paid or is paid after the mandatory deadline, the remaining balance becomes delinquent. What happens if I'm late in paying my taxes? All delinquent taxes are subject to interest and penalty charges from February 1 until paid (fraction of a month counts as a whole month). What's on my ballot?

Access https://myvote.wi.gov/en-us/ and click on the WHATS ON MY BALLOT tile

Where do I vote and what are the hours of voting on Election Day?

Voting is held at the City Hall, located at 201 E Main Street. You may take the steps to enter the front of City Hall or enter the lower level-west entrance door to access the elevator. Voting hours are 7:00am to 8:00pm.

Can I vote early in-person?

Yes, you may vote in person in the City Hall Clerk's Office from Tuesday, July 26 to Thursday, August 4 (Monday-Friday 8:00am to 4:00pm) and Friday, August 5 (8:00am to 5:00pm)

What is the last day I can vote early in-person?

The last day you can vote early in-person is Friday, August 5 by 5pm

Can I get a ballot mailed to me?

Yes, we can mail you a ballot between the dates of Thursday, June 23 to Thursday, August 4. There are several ways you can request a ballot be mailed to you:

- 1. Access https://myvote.wi.gov/en-us/ and click on Vote Absentee
- 2. Complete the WI Elections Commission Absentee Ballot Request form and return it to the City Clerk https://elections.wi.gov/search/node?keys=el-121
- 3. Email the City Clerk angie@cityofwaupun.org making a request for a ballot be mailed to you. Provide your full name, Waupun address, date of birth and the full address of where you would like it mailed. If we do not have a copy of your photo ID on file, you will receive an email making request for the document before a ballot can be placed in the mail.

What is the last date I can request an absentee ballot be mailed to me?

The last date you can request for a ballot be mailed to you is Thursday, August 4 by 5:00pm

How do I return the absentee ballot that was mailed to me?

There are several ways to return your voted ballot:

- 1. Postal Mail. When the Clerk mails you the ballot, included is a return envelope which postage is already applied. Be sure to have your signature and the signature/address of your witness on the exterior of the return envelope or it will be returned to you.
- In-person. You may return <u>YOUR</u> voted ballot in the sealed return envelope during the City Clerk office hours (Monday-Friday 8:00am-4:00pm). <u>YOU CAN NO LONGER PLACE THEM IN THE DROP BOX. YOU</u> CAN NO LONGER BRING IN ANYONE ELSE'S VOTED BALLOT.

When do I have to have my absentee ballot to the City Clerk to be counted?

Your voted ballot, with your signature and the signature/address of your witness on the exterior of the return envelope, must be in the hands of the Clerk, no later than 8:00pm on Election Day.
